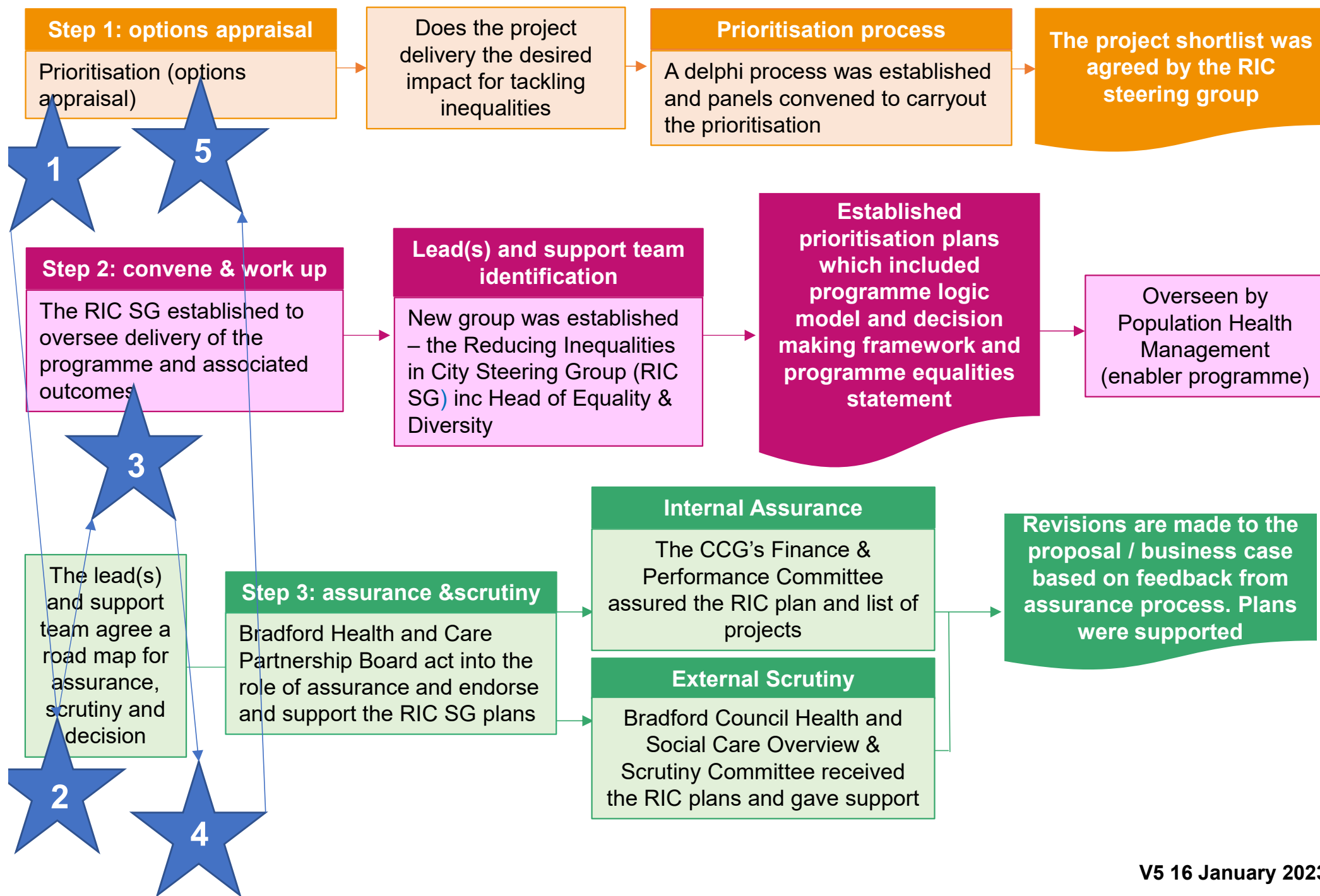
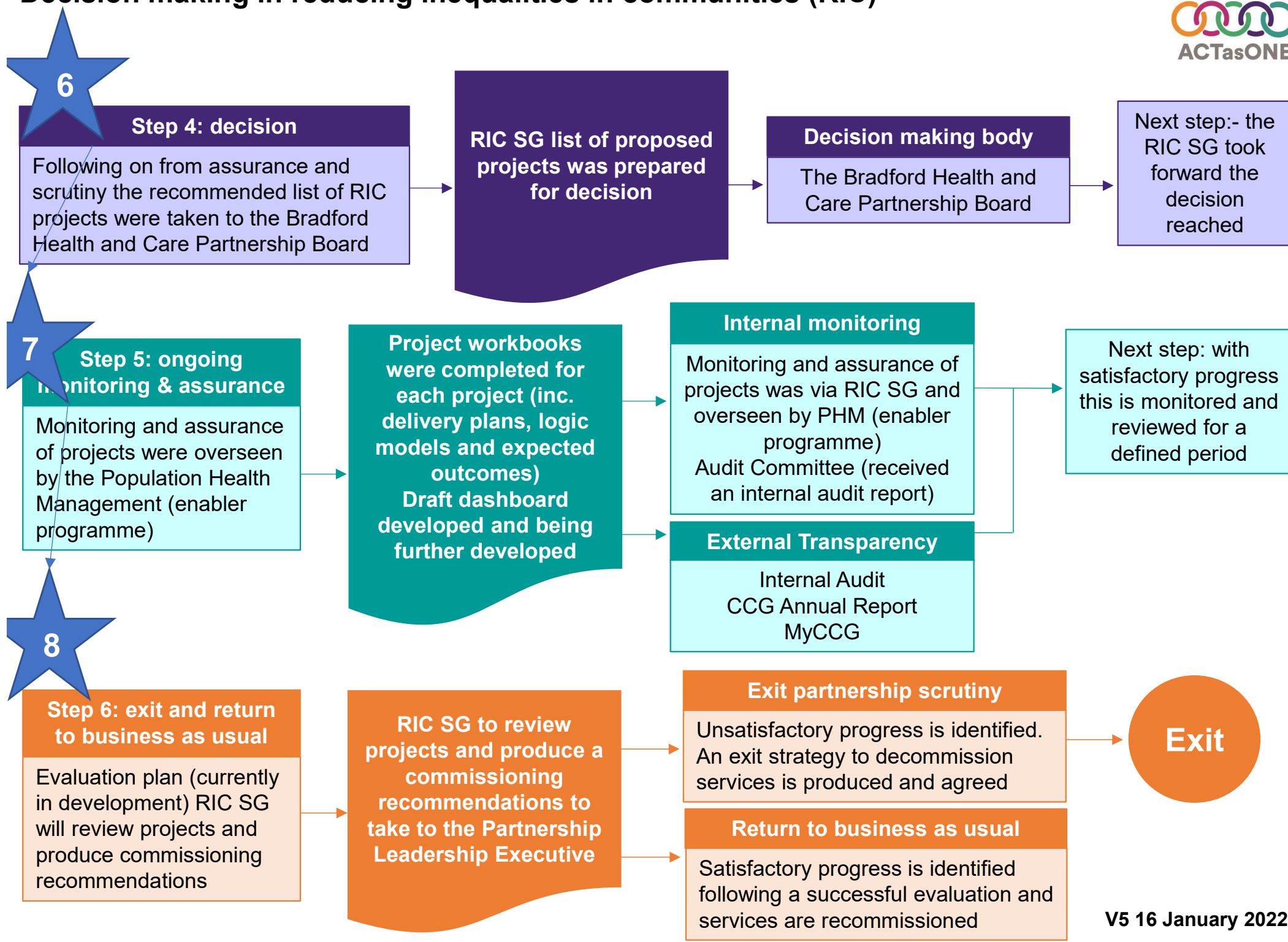


Decision making in reducing inequalities in communities (RIC)



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1. Step 1 - increased funding allocation made to NHS Bradford City CCG and Clinical Board decided to use this funding to reduce inequalities
2. Step 3 - decision taken to create the RIC programme to coordinate activity and make data driven decisions
3. Step 2 – convene and workup - the RIC steering group (RIC SG) is established to oversee delivery of the programme and associated outcomes. RIC SG establish prioritisation plans which include programme logic model and decision making framework
4. Step 3 – assurance & scrutiny - Bradford Health and Care Partnership Board acting in an assurance role endorsed and supported the RIC plans Step 2 – convene and workup – the RIC task and finish groups (linked to programmes) develop proposals, overseen by the NHS Bradford City CCG Clinical Board and the RIC SG
5. Step 1 –project prioritisation (options appraisal) – a delphi process was established and panels convened to carry out the prioritisation process; the project shortlist was agreed by the RIC SG
6. Step 4 – funding decision – recommended list of projects agreed by Bradford Health and Care Partnership Board and assured Finance & Performance Group. Plans supported by HOSC. RIC SG to progress project mobilisation
7. Step 5 – monitoring - project workbooks completed for each project, which include delivery plans, logic models and expected outcomes RIC SG reviews and approves each one and RIC and project monitoring is overseen by the RIC SG. With progress overseen by Population Health Management enabler programme. External assurance – reviewed by internal audit in December 2021 the RIC programme achieved significant assurance
8. Step 6 – exit plans and return to business as usual - include an evaluation plan (currently under development) RIC SG will review projects and produce commissioning recommendations by August 2023. With RIC recommendation to be made to the Partnership Leadership Executive in September 2023. Providers to be notified of commissioning intentions by October 2023. (commissioning outcome – re / de commissioning activity will be needed
